PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Communicating critical safety information, either proactively or during a weather-related event, is an effective way local government can ensure the protection of its residents. Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services, a joint city-county utility in North Carolina, has exemplified this approach by expanding on the National Weather Service's Severe Weather preparedness outreach through an extended multimedia campaign.



Storm Water Services produced 15-second ads featuring flood safety tips.

This messaging is vital to residents because flooding is a natural threat to our area. National Weather Service data suggests more than half of flood-related deaths happen in vehicles. Storm Water Services data indicates flooding is the costliest natural disaster in Mecklenburg County.

The campaign included four 15-second flood safety commercial spots to air on local television and streaming service, having staff available for media interviews, included messaging in utility bills sent to residents, a large digital billboard on a highly visible parking garage, and daily paid social media posts focused on flood safety tips.

Timing our campaign with the National Weather Service's **Severe Weather Preparedness Week** drew added interest from local media and residents.

OUTREACH/MEASUREMENTS



Social media:

Storm Water Services began running special flood safety messages on social media the first day of Severe Weather Preparedness Week and continued throughout the week.

Facebook and Instagram
Impressions for the week - 149,448
Clicks - 236
Total Cost - \$518.55

Cost per reach was \$0.01, the lowest of any of our social media ads.

TV: Important flood safety information was communicated through 12, 15-second TV spots appearing on local CBS affiliate WBTV. These ads generated more than 149,000 impressions and reached 6.2% of the Charlotte-area market in just one week.

Digital Streaming Service/Over the Top (OTT) Video: Streaming of 15-second video ads resulted in 5,223 impressions and a video completion rate of 98.4 percent.

Digital Billboard: According to NC Department of Transporation records in 2021, the digital billboard located on the 4th Street parking garage is viewed by approximately 14,000 people per day. (98,000 for the week)

Utility Bill Insert: The March monthly utility bill insert with flood safety messaging (presented in both English and Spanish) was sent to approximately 180,000 Mecklenburg County residents and boosted the one-week Severe Weather Preparedness project.

City Publications: Articles were also included in Crown Weekly,a digital publication that is distributed to 8,000+ City of Charlotte employees, and Storm Water Services Employee News,a digital newsletter distributed to 200+ Storm Water Services staff.

COST THE OUTREACH AND MATERIALS

IMPACT/EFFECTIVENESS

Promoting several flood safety messages through multiple channels helped Storm Water Services communicate critical information to the more than 1 million residents in Mecklenburg County, which includes the City of Charlotte and six surrounding towns.

Communicating flood safety information is required for FEMA's Community Rating System score, which determines a community's flood insurance discount. Charlotte's Class 3 rating provides a 35% savings to residents or approximately \$1.2 million in flood insurance cost savings per year.






It's Severe Weather Preparedness Week, so we're sharing flood safety tips. To start out the week, today's tip: remember, flooding can happen anywhere! Even outside of the floodplain. In fact, about 28% of flood insurance claims in Mecklenburg County are from properties outside the floodplain.

Flooding can happen anywhere, even outside of the floodplain.





Mecklenburg County's most common, and most expensive, natural disaster. Be weather aware and flood safe!




Flood Safety Tip #3: Don't underestimate flood water! Just 6" of moving flood water can knock over a grown adult. And 12"-24" of rushing water can carry away most cars, trucks and SUVs! Don't risk driving through - turn around!



FLOOD SAFETY TIP #3

Just 6 inches of moving flood water can knock over an adult, 12-24 inches of rushing water can carry away most cars, trucks and SUVs. Don't underestimate flood water!




Flood Safety Tip #4: Don't attempt to drive through flood waters. You never know how deep it actually is (even a small amount is dangerous!) AND you never know what is under it - tree limbs, giant holes, broken bridges, downed electrical wire. Turn around, don't drown!



FLOOD SAFETY TIP #4

Driving through flood conditions can have deadly consequences! You never know how deep water is or what's in it. Stay flood safe, and turn around don't drown!



Flood Safety Tip #5: Be aware of floodplains. These are areas that are most likely to experience flooding during storms and are a vital part of a healthy creek system! Floodplains help manage flooding naturally, but should be avoided during storms!



FLOOD SAFETY TIP #5

What is a floodplain? These are the areas along streams or rivers that are most likely to experience flooding.

Though they sound scary, floodplains are part of a healthy creek system and help manage flooding naturally.

DYK, knowing how to prepare for flash flooding is an important part of being weather aware! See below for the guidelines for our area:


- Sign up for CharMeck Alerts and have a battery-operated radio ready
- ▲ Make a plan! Know where to go and communicate it to family and neighbors
- During a flood, seek shelter and follow news updates
- Never drive through flood waters!
- After a flood, listen to authorities and beware of driving and water contamination risks



- Turn Around, Don't Drown. Six inches of rushing water can knock a person over and just a foot of rushing water can carry away a car.
